of the meeting of the
EUROPE CONFEDERATION WATERSKI COUNCIL
held at the
CIVITEL ATTIK HOTEL, ATHENS, GREECE
on Friday 31st January and Sunday 2nd February 2020

1. Attendance and apologies for absence

The meeting commenced at 0900. Candido welcomed all members to the EC Waterski Council meeting. Morten Froulund joined the meeting on Sunday as a guest observer.

This was the final meeting, as members of the Waterski Council, for both Inessa Potes and Nigel Talamo. Inessa announced her retirement at the Minsk meeting and Nigel decided not to stand for re-election. Chairman Candido formally thanked both Inessa and Nigel for their years of service to the council and wished them both success in their future projects. With Inessa's absence, Nigel took the minutes for the Friday meeting with James Timothy taking over for the Sunday session.

The British Federation wanted to propose James Timothy for election but missed the deadline for nominations. The council has a heavy workload and needs members. Since James could not be elected, the council decided to co-opt him for the coming term.

*James Timothy is an independently secure skier. He is the inventor and manufacturer of the *Sure-Path* GPS boat lane tracking system and the soon to be released *Sure-Path* autosteer equipment. On entering the Council, James made clear that he would withdraw his opinion on any sensitive issues where it may be seen that he has a conflict of interest.

2. Approval of the Minutes of the November TC meeting

The minutes of the Waterski Council held on Saturday the 9th and Sunday the 10th of November 2019 at the Victoria Olimp Hotel, Minsk, were approved as a true record.

3. Matters Arising from the Minutes and items from Other Business

a) Current state of EMS system: There was an extended discussion regarding workings of the EMS. Now that the system is up and running and that many people have been invited to join, the site is becoming more populated. It is easy to see the potential of the EMS and realise that it will soon become indispensable to the running of our sport. The Council were all encouraged to update their personal records and play about with the parameters. The more we understand it, the easier it will be to help other parties use the system. Dimos and Hannu, who have both been integral to the progress of the EMS cleared up some misconceptions and mapped out their expectations for the coming season.

The EMS administrators need accurate information from federations in order to input data on officials and athletes. It is up to Federations to contact athletes, organisers and officials and ensure that they are clear on how to address the system. The EMS administrators and the Council accept that the the first year will be an uphill task.

b) IWWF Ranking List Licence Fee: The licence fee payable by athletes to enter Ranking List events has been delayed because many National Federations are not yet ready to implement the process. It will now commence in September 2020. The fees are set at US\$ 25 for an annual licence (unlimited competitions) or US\$ 7 (for up to 3 competitions a year). c) Drivers Commission: The announcement in the November meeting minutes that the Drivers Commission had been abandoned was not well written and some drivers took umbrage. The Waterski Council apologises for not being more sensitive. The drivers' commission (along with other specialist commissions and the Waterski Council itself) are only elected for 2 year terms. A new Drivers' Commission will be formed and should be prepared to start work from the beginning of the 2020 season. The Waterski council is looking for Drivers to volunteer to form this new commission. They must be prepared to work together to solve problems and come up with Driver related recommendations. Drivers Commission members will not receive any meeting allowance.

d) Medals: The medal requirements will now be handled by Ricardo. The order will be sent to the supplier by mid March 2020

4. Election of European Confederation Waterski Council members

The election was made during the Congress on Saturday morning, 1st February 2020. All members were re-elected. In addition, James Timothy (GBR) was co-opted to serve on the Council. During lunch, the make up of the Waterski Council was decided. It is now as follows:

* Officials at these World events will also receive an additional sum directly from the IWWF raised from entry fees.

The combined U21 and Open E&A Championships were due to be held at Ioannina (GRE). Due to a political situation within the federation, these competitions plus the E&A Disabled Championships cannot yet be confirmed. If the situation is not resolved

by the end of February, the championships will be moved. There are 2 sites willing to step in to hold these events. The sites for all events will be confirmed before the April Seminar.

7. Officials

a) Officials activity and Qualifications. Activity has been monitored and any corrections to qualifications have been made. Donal will generate the data which will be published in the April minutes.

d) Calendar 2020: The latest calendar is available via the EMS, <https://ems.iwwf.sport> Alternatively you may navigate to it directly <https://eu.jotform.com/table/73122760650046> Officials can inscribe themselves as available for tournaments using either system but are encouraged to start using the EMS as soon as they are able.

e) Benelux Championships: Belgium, Luxembourg and the Netherlands have few active skiers and fewer active officials. With such small numbers, it is hard to hold a viable competition. They have asked if they can unite and hold 1 Combined National Championships. The Council have agreed.

8. Major Event Panels

a) Call for interest in all E&A Titled events: Until the site for the E&A Open and U21 Championships can be confirmed, the calendar cannot be confirmed (*see item 6b above*). The call will be sent as soon as is feasible. The Waterski Council will, as usual, hold an online conference before the April Seminar to appoint officials from the applications received.

b) Nomination of European officials to World Titles: From applications received, the Waterski Council has nominated officials for the following 3 World events. Final selection will be made by the World Waterski Council from the applications received from all regions. (European Officials will receive travel grants as outlined in 6b above.)

9. Skiers

a) Ranking List comparison: Comparison of the World and European versions of the ranking list was made as usual. It is noted that there were many fewer corrections to be made this year.

b) Skier of the year: Certificates awarded to E&A Skiers of the year were prepared, signed and presented during the congress.

10. World Rules & World Waterski Council Issues

a) Women 45+ shortening speed: During the Malaysian meeting in July, the World Waterski Council approved a proposal to reduce the 45+ Women's shortening speed from 55 kph to 52 kph. Since then, there has been a considerable backlash from athletes (mainly European & North American) who disagree with the decision and want it reversed. Oceania, Asia and Latin America are predominately behind retaining the new shortening speed (52 kph). Meanwhile the southern hemisphere is mid-way through their season. Their 45+ athletes have been training with the 52kph shortening speed so that they are well prepared for the forthcoming 35+ Worlds.

To resolve the situation, for this season only, the World Waterski Council has put to the vote the following proposal:

For the remainder of the Southern season and for the forthcoming Northern season, 45+ Ladies skiers will be able to select, before the first pass, to shorten at either 52 or 55 kph. Score will be made on buoy count.

It was noted that to avoid possible confusion, where scoring is done on buoy count, published results should show the buoy count as well as the speed and rope length of the final pass.

b) New age categories: Also at the Malaysian meeting, the Council decided to create new senior age divisions: 70+, 75+, 80+, 85+. The European Waterski Council discussed the merits and have proposed that the upper age limits be removed and that an age category will only be opened if there are a minimum number of entrants. The proposal if adopted will also solve the 45+ issue above. The proposal reads:

*There shall be no upper age limit for any age category. Athletes may apply to compete in any age division younger than their own.
[For instance: A 54 year old skier may compete in the 45+ category or a 75 year old may compete in 55+ or 45+ if they feel confident or more comfortable in that age category.]
In order for an age category to commence, a minimum of 5 skiers (across 3 events) must be entered and paid for. For World Titles, there must be a minimum of 3 competitors in an event.*

c) Proposed criteria for ratification of new GPS based boat tracking systems: The latest version was discussed and accepted.

11. Athlete Commission report

Manon was unable to attend the Athens meeting so no report was presented.

12. Admincom visit and Matters from last Administrative Committee

Admincom members Sid, Morten and Dominique plus Secretary General Dame Gill Hill visited on Friday morning. They were joined by IWWF President José Antonio Pérez Priego and Pan Am Secretary General Karen McClintock.

a) Funds: Some minor issues regarding additional funds were cleared up with Dominique.

b) Downgraded results, sanctioned officials: As a result of slalom end course examination last year, some results were downgraded. Furthermore the Waterski Council decided to recommend sanctions be applied to some officials and organisers.

c) Address from IWWF President José Antonio Pérez Priego: José Antonio had 3 topics which he wanted the Council to consider.

i/ He wanted our opinion on the lowered shortening speed for 45+ ladies because of the backlash from high level athletes. (*see also 11a above*) It is a question of whether the IWWF should be more concerned with a few top athletes or those further down the performance strata.

ii/ Should 65+ skiers be considered to be part of the team (for titled events)

iii/ Should age categories be open ended and not limited to strict 10 year (or 5 year) brackets. Gill Hill was of the opinion that the strict 10 year brackets were a recent application and was not clear on when this changed. (*see also item 11b above*). We need to decide on which age categories to hold at the 2020 35+ Worlds in France. It is important to

attract people to the big tournaments and getting the age divisions correct can make a category viable.

13. Admincom Visit (Sunday)

Incoming President Patrice Martin visited the meeting on Sunday together with Sid.

In addressing the meeting, Patrice congratulated those present on their re-election to the Council. There was a lot of work to be done in regard to the new Event Management System (EMS). He advised the committee that Candido would have a lot of work to do in his role on the World Council and that his E&A duties should be shared as much as possible.

He reminded members that although they were all supported by their home Federations, their duty on this committee was to the E&A.

The Bureau has not changed much but some change is on the way. Patrice requested that individual divisions consider their vision for the future and make this known to the Bureau.

There was an exchange of views on proposals regarding World Rules governing 35+ age categories and also U17s.

Candido thanked Patrice and Sid for their visit.

14. Correspondence

a) Letter from the GBR Waterski Committee: The British were sent a warning and awarded some sanctions after the end course investigations last year. Whilst they understood the concern of the Council regarding boat path at one competition, they did not appreciate the manner and approach of the Council letter. They felt that the tone of the letter would alienate committed volunteers and organisers.

In response, Candido sent a personal letter with further explanation.

b) Letter from Drivers' Commission representative: One of the members of the Drivers Commission took exception to the way that the Commission had been dismissed. (see item 3d above). Candido replied to explain the tenure of all commissions was limited to 2 years.

15. Distribution of Council Member workload

Candido stays as Chairman, Stian continues as Treasurer and James agreed to take over as Secretary. Ricardo will produce the bulletin and organize the medals.

16. Other Business

a) Minsk site inspection: Minsk (BLR) is scheduled to host the 2022 FISU Worlds at the Minsk site. The event will be Waterski, Wakeboard and possibly Cableski also. Whilst the Cable installation is

very good, accurate and well maintained, the same cannot be said of the adjacent boat site. Until now they have only hosted lower level competitions to Normal homologation. There is the possibility of using a completely new site near the city centre for the boat events. Whether the existing site is upgraded or a new site is used, an inspection needs to be made in good time.

b) Platform used for online exams: Candido advised that the current platform would not be continuing. James agreed to look into possible alternatives. Moodle.com looked a promising alternative and is used by many educational establishments.

c) Online entry forms for titled events: EMS cannot yet produce these and for this year, traditional methods should be continued.
